It is that time of year again, time to renew our dues for 2024. Our Annual Dues are \$55. Our target date for having everyone pay their dues is: October 31, 2023. We accept cash or check, and you can turn in your dues to me at our monthly meeting or you can mail your check, made payable to American Legion Post 30, to:

Membership in The American Legion is based on a calendar-year from January 1st to December 31st. When a member pays their dues, they are paid up for that membership year. They will also receive twelve monthly subscriptions to The American Legion Magazine.

The renewal process begins in July for the upcoming membership year. Renewal notices are sent out in July, October, January, March, and May. When a member renews, they are removed from future renewal notices for that year. There are times when a member pays their dues, but they still receive a renewal notice. If dues are paid to the local post, it takes a little longer for National to be notified about the renewal and the member may receive another renewal notice. If this occurs, please check with me to ensure they have received your dues.

Recap of June Events

We had the pleasure of hosting Edgefield County Sheriff Jody Rowland and a few of his deputies along with members from American Legion Post 154 and 222 from Johnston, and VFW Post 6932 from Edgefield during our meeting on June 15. After an outstanding dinner prepared by our supper committee Sheriff Rowland gave a presentation and update on the new law enforcement center being built on Rabbit Trail Road. The law enforcement center is the largest capital construction project in the county's history and will be a major upgrade to our current facility which was built in the 1970's. The new facility will house the entire Sheriff's Department, a detention center, evidence storage, an officer training area, offices for the Magistrate and staff, and a first for the county, a Magistrate's courtroom. To say that Sheriff Rowland is excited about the new facility is an understatement. The facility is on track to be completed in 2024.

After Sherriff Rowland's presentation Distinguished Community Service Awards were presented to former Sherriff Billy Parker, former Edgefield Police Chief Mack Ryans, former Trenton Police Chief Deke Tanks, and former County Coroner Thurmond Burnette. These four men served Edgefield County and its citizens for more than 150 years. Sheriff Rowland presented the plaque to Billy Parker, Edgefield Police Chief Ronnie Carter presented the plaque to Mack Ryans, Trenton Police Chief Josh Corley presented the plaque to Deke Tanks, and Edgefield County Coroner David Burnette presented to plaque to his father Thurmond Burnette.

Bobby Lee Hammond Jr, Colonel, U.S. Air Force, retired, is our Legionnaire of the Quarter. Bobby was born in 1935 in Augusta, GA. Throughout his career Col Hammond was stationed at the Strategic Air Command, Military Airlift command, flew combat missions in Vietnam, provided air support to the Berlin Crisis, Cuban Crisis, Just Cause (Grenada), Urgent Fury (Panama), and was part of the airlift that recovered hostages from Iran. Col Hammond was awarded the Legion of Merit, Meritorious Service Medal, Air Force Commendation Medal w/OLC, Combat Readiness Medal w/8 OLCs, Vietnam Service Medal, Humanitarian Service Medal, National Defense Service Medal, and many more. Bobby has been a member of Post 30 for 26 years.
